Schweiker's legislation (introduced Friday, August 5) provides that any member of a recognized religious sect in existence since at least 1950, who can show that he is an adherent of established teachings which cause him to be conscientiously opposed to acceptance of Social Security benefits, may file an application to be entitled to a credit or refund of the legislation in 1970 and wage tax. 
