Heifers mostly 800-950 lbs. and about 35 per cent of receipts; cows barely 4 per cent. Demand fairly good for Choice and Prime steers over 1150 lbs. and heifers over 900 lbs. But relatively light for Good or loads Mixed Good and Choice and lighter weights.
