BELT FEEDER

P & D Mfg. Co. Inc., is marketing a belt feeder with multi-lot feeding capabilities for beef and dairy operations. The continuously operating belt is fed from a hopper and is equipped with a plow which deposits feed into the bank. Optional multi-lot divider, control box and switches will allow feeding different rations to two, three, or four lots or more. The feeder uses no augers or brushes, has a separate instant reverse motor and operates with low horsepower requirements.

The low noise level belt feeder is said to deposit feed into the bunk with no sifting or separation and provides uniform distribution of silage, haylage, grain, supplements or almost any combination of ingredients. SWINE MEDICINE

A bacterin for use as an aid in the control of bordetella bronchiseptica infection in swine is being marketed by Chromanoy Ammai re of Omaha, Nebraska.

This bacterin, AR Bac, has USDA licensing, and is available to swine producers as a first line of defense against atrophic rhinitis.

The Chromalloy product is administered subcutaneously in the fold of the pig's flank at seven days of age as the pig is unable to respond to the vaccination until that age. Then a booster should be given at 28 days of age to cause maximum immunity. The bacterin is non-oily, chemically mactivited and incapable of transmitting the disease. It is a suspension of specially selected and highly immunogenic strain of bordetella bronchiseptica and 1s free from content causing adverse tissue reaction. AR Bac also has a very low potential for producing allergic reactions.

The product is available from the same animal health suppliers handling Armidexan, iron dextran injection, and it should be an answer to one of the more severe disease problems facing hog producers.

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
