Price slump continues

WASHINGTON - USDA responsible for the August reported recently that the Index of Prices Received by Farmers decreased three per cent during the month ended last Aug. 15. It was the third straight month decline, the Department announced.

Lower prices for soybeans, feed grains, hogs, broilers and potatoes were mainly decline.

Corn averaged \$1.64 per bu., down 24 cents; oats averaged 90.6 cents, down 11.4 cents from July. Sorghum grain averaged \$2.75, down 9 cents; barley, \$1.50, down 3 cents per bu. Hay averaged \$52.50 per ton, down \$4.30 from July and

over-all feed grains and hay index was down 10 pct. from a month earlier, 33 pct. from a year ago. Soybeans, at \$5.34 per bu., were off \$1.26 from a month earlier, \$2.87 per bu. below a year ago.

Hog prices averaged \$42.80 per hundredweight (cwt.), down .0 from July; broilers, 23.9 cents per lb., down 2.3 cents; potatoes averaged \$4.56 per cwt., down 58 cents from July.
