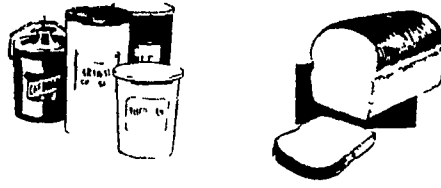
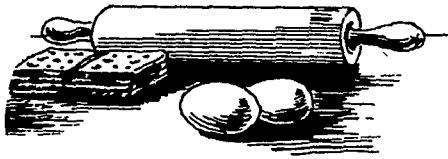


# Home on



# The Range

Well, it will soon be pumpkin season once again. When that time rolls around, there's always the question, "What do I do with pumpkins besides making jack-o-lanterns and pumpkin pies with them? This week "Home on the Range" answers that question with 16 different recipes from some of our readers.

According to the many responses we had to this theme, pumpkins are important main ingredients in many a bread and dessert.

Unfortunately, several of our contributors sent in identical or nearly identical recipes this week, and we were only able to print one of each. All of you who did help by sending in contributions received a little thank-you gift from us, and we are hoping you will try again so that your particular recipe can be printed next time.

### PUMPKIN PIE SQUARES

- 1 cup sifted flour
- ½ cup quick-cooking rolled oats
- ½ cup brown sugar



- ½ cup butter
  - 2 cups pumpkin, cooked and pureed
  - 1 can evaporated milk (13-½ oz.)
  - 2 eggs
  - ½ cup granulated sugar
  - ½ teaspoon salt
  - 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
  - ½ teaspoon ground ginger
  - ¼ teaspoon ground cloves
  - ½ cup chopped pecans
  - ¼ cup brown sugar
  - 2 tablespoons butter
- Combine sifted flour, rolled oats, brown sugar, and butter in mixing bowl.

Mix until crumbly, using electric mixer on low speed. Press into ungreased 6 by 10 by 2 inch pan. Bake at 350 degrees F. for 15 minutes. While that mixture is

baking, combine pumpkin, evaporated milk, eggs, granulated sugar, salt, ground cinnamon, ginger, and cloves in mixing bowl. Beat well. Pour into baked crust and return to oven for 20 minutes. Last of all, combine chopped pecans, brown sugar, and butter. Sprinkle over pumpkin filling. Again, return to oven and bake for 15 to 20 minutes or until filling is set. Cool in pan, then cut into squares. Serve with a dollop of whipped cream.

- 1-¾ cup graham cracker crumbs
  - ¾ cup granulated sugar
  - ½ cup butter or margarine
  - 2 egg yolks
  - ¾ cup sugar
  - 8 oz. package cream cheese
  - 2 cups pumpkin, cooked
  - 3 egg yolks
  - ½ cup granulated sugar
  - ½ cup milk
  - ½ teaspoon salt
  - 1 tablespoon cinnamon
  - 1 package unflavored gelatin
- Mix together graham crackers crumbs, ½ cup
