GRATZ - The swine competition at the Gratz Fair took place the Wednesday of fair week. Six breeds of animals were shown in the open show with the following results:

SPOTTED SWINE

The Spotted Swine open show competition at the Gratz Fair was dominated by Claire Hartman, Gratz, Pa. Hartman took the first place January boar pig division, the February boar

pig, March boar pig, and the champion boar honors.

In Spotted Swine sow competition, Hartman also had first placings in the January sow, February sow, and April sow categories. The Dauphin County breeder then took grand champion sow of this breed, as well as young herd, get of sire, and produce of dam.

Giving Hartman competition was Kevin Brown, Leckkill, Pa. Brown had the reserve champion boar, first

place March sow, and reserve champion sow.

YORKSHIRE

In Yorkshire competition, the Preston Bankert family, Red Lion, kept it "all in the family" at the Gratz fair.

In boar competition, Wayne Bankert had the first place January, March, and champion boar pigs. Michael Bankert won the first placings in the February and April boar pigs, taking the reserve championship title, as well.

With sows, Wayne Bankert had the first place January, March, and reserve champion sows, as well as first place get of sire.

Michael came out on top with the grand champion sow as well as produce of dam, February sow, and April sow.

HAMPSHIRE

The Bankerts also swept all Hampshire classes. Preston and Michele alternated wins in all sow and boar classes with Preston taking the champion sow and reserve champion sow and Michele winning the reserve champion boar and champion sow titles.

The open class Berkshire competition had one exhibitor - Dennis Grumbine, Myerstown, Pa.

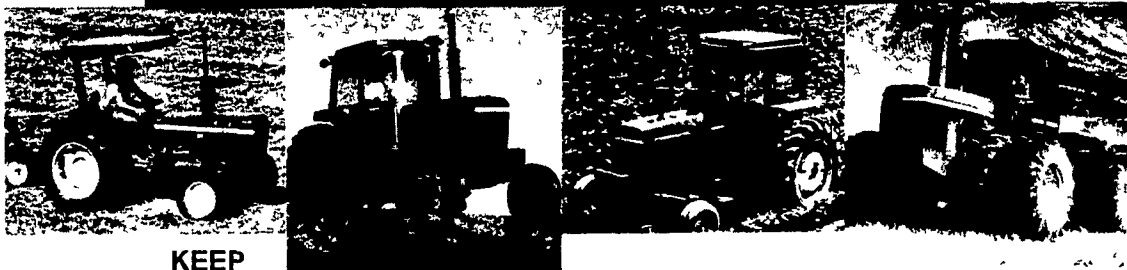
CHESTER WHITE

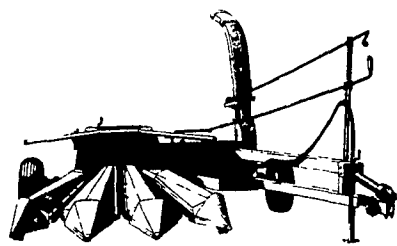

FREY FREE STALL LIFETIME FREE STALL HOUSING



Cut bedding costs 75 per cent, reduce labor for barn cleaning and cow washing, reduce teat and udder injury to the minimum — house your milking herd in free stall housing. Each cow provided a stall for loafing. She won't be stepped on, the rear curb forces manure out into alley for mechanical cleaning or washing. A few minutes twice a day cleans the stalls and curbs, bedding lasts almost forever if your stalls fit the cows. Popular sizes are 6'6", 7' and 7'6". Size 'em by breed.

Our free stall partition may be mounted on wooden head boards or we make a steel divider. Set the legs in 8 to 10" concrete curbs to hold and retain bedding. Stall floor can be soil, sand or gravel. Bedding — straw, sawdust, peanut hulls, ground corn cobs, etc. Should be installed with paved alley surface 8 feet wide for mechanical cleaning or washing.
