Marylanders dominate cow judging

HARRISBURG - Individuals and teams from Maryland dominated the Invitational Youth Dairy Cattle Judging contest held Monday, the opening event of the 14th Annual Pennsylvania All-American Dairy Show, taking two individual and all three team titles.

Judging began early Monday morning in the Farm Show's main exhibition hall with 38 teams competing in 4-H, FFA and Intercollegiate divisions. The 4-H and FFA teams had all previously been declared their home state championship teams.

The University of Maryland captured the intercollegiate trophy while the Maryland 4-H and FFA teams were wrapping up the titles in their own divisions.

The University of Maryland team scored 2017 points to top teams from Cornell University with 1956 points and the Delaware Valley College in Doylestown, Pa., which scored with 1946 points.

Top individual performance in the intercollegiate division went to Jerry Myers, Westminster, Md., of the victorious University of Maryland team, with 718 points. Sandra Haag

of Cornell University placed second with 687 points and Walter Owens of the University of Wisconsin at River Falls finished third with 680 points.

In addition to Delaware Valley's third place finish, Pennsylvania State University was ninth in a field of 17 teams.

Maryland again captured the 4-H team trophy this year, finishing out with 1725 points. Kentucky's 4-H team placed second with 1715, edging out the third place team from Virginia which ended the competition with 1712 points.

The only individual to break the Maryland stranglehold on the awards was James Tipton of Taylorville, Ky., who captured the

individual 4-H honors with 595 points, five points ahead of Ralph W. Shank of Hagerstown, Md. Third place individual in 4-H judging was Keith McLean of Amsterdam, Ohio, with 590 points.

The Maryland FFA team squeaked out another victory over Virginia's entry by a 1423-1421 score. Indiana's FFA team placed third with a 1413 score.

John Doody of Damascus, Md. took individual honors in FFA judging with 509 points. Brian Davis of Middlebrook, Va., was second over Tom Milin of Cazenovia, N.Y. by 506-499.

Pennsylvania's teams finished twelfth and sixth in 4-H and FFA competitions, respectively.
