Judge William Holloway, the manager of South Branch Farms, Seven Valleys R1, said he chose the grand champion over the reserve because "it showed the most total red meat in the form of muscling and natural thickness." According to Holloway, the animal should prove to be a high yielding steer which will grade choice.

In the showmanship contest, Linda High, Creek Hill Road, Lancaster, repeated last year's championship win.

Miss Lapp, whose father is known for his Belgian horses, is a six year 4-H member. This year she chose to show a Landrace/Hampshire corssbred


