Pa. ranks high in regional FFA judging

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. -In the 15-state North Atlantic Regional FFA judging contest held at the Eastern States Exposition in West Springfield, Mass., recently, Pennsylvania placed higher, consistently, than any other state participating.

All told, the Pennsylvania FFA'ers racked up two first placings - in dairy cattle judging and safe tractor operating. Three second rank berths also went to the


Commonwealth in milk quality and dairy foods judging; agrıcultural mechanics, small gas engines; and livestock judging.

The top ranking dairy cattle judging team was comprised of Steve Ritchey, Loysburg; David Pittman, Loysburg; and Herb Clapper, New Enterprise R1. The team's strong area was in Ayrshire judging in which they were named the high team of the contest.

Individually, Steve Ritchev was the first place judge over all members involved in the contest, winning his highest recognition in judging Brown Swiss.

David Pittman was rated seventh, individually, over all dairy cattle judges.
