



means of harvesting maximum feed nutrients. Many acres of ear corn will be stored in the usual cribs and in most cases will continue to dry out with natural air movement. Many growers get into trouble with their shelled corn and the attempt to store it properly. Most shelled corn needs some supplemental heat to aid in the drying process; this should be followed by a cooling process during the fall and winter Through the use of air ducts and fans, the air can be pushed through the corn to prevent heating and moding. All areas should be rodent proofed in order to keep rat and mice damage to a minimum. *****************************


