## Homemakers can create flowers from ribbon

About 35 homemaker leaders attended the fourhour seminar, bringing with them a variety of fresh flowers and equipment for on-the-spot arranging experience.
Mrs. Fuhrman first taught the method of creating a spray of flowers made from satin ribbon. For variety in texture and colors of the finished product, the flowers can also be constructed using delicate fabrics, such as organdy or dotted swiss. Leaves for the floral spray are made in the same fashion, using green colored ribbon or material.
Each petal is fashioned from a square of ribbon. For her demonstration, Mrs. Fuhrman chose unmber 9

ribbon, which is about four inches wide. Fold the square into a triangle (Fig. A.), then again into another triangle (Fig. B.). With the rough edges at the bottom, loosely pleat the bottom of the triangle (Fig C.). Holding the bunched ribbon firmly between your fingers, wrap (Continued on Page 54)
