Holstein banners go to Md. and N.Y.

HARRISBURG - Farms from Maryland and New York were named the premier breeder and premier exhibitor on Friday of last week at the Eastern National Holstein Show held in conjunction with the Pennsylvania All-American Dairy Show in Harrisburg.

Dreamstreet Holsteins, Walton, N.Y., was named the premier breeder of the show. A Dreamstreet Farms cow, 4-year-old Kerchenbill Champion Ivy, was named reserve senior and reserve grand champion female.

Kingstead Farms, Damascus, Md., took the premier breeder honors to cap off their showing at the two-day event in the State Farm Show complex. Kingstead Farms' 2-year-old

bull, Kingstead Monty, was named reserve senior champion bull in the show.

The grand champion and senior champion female Holstein was Jeraldine Cinnamon Supreme, a 4-year-old cow exhibited by Steven H. Vaughn of Maize Valley Farm, Hartsville, Ohio.

Grand champion bull honors went to Hobbshaven Fury Nat, a 3-year-old bull exhibited by Price View Farm, Amboy, Ind. Hobbshaven Fury Nat was named senior champion bull enroute to the grand championship.

Pinehurst Farms of Sheboygan Falls, Wis., showed the junior champion and reserve grand champion bull, a senior yearling bull

named Pinehurst Debonair. Another Pinehurst Farms entry, Pinehurst Dorrine, a senior yearling heifer, was given the laurels as junior champion female.

The reserve junior champion bull was Smith Mead Firecracker, a bull calf exhibited by Fair Hill Holsteins of Frederick, Md. Reserve junior female honors went to "Cherokee-Tn-Rorae Supreme," a senior yearling heifer owned by the Lewis Cherokee Farm and Johnson, of Hamilton, Ohio.

The premier sire award went to "Round Oak Rag Apple Elevation," owned by Select Sires, Columbus, Ohio.

Judging the many entries in the Eastern National Holstein Show were Velmar Green of Elsie, Mich., and associate judge David P. Dickson, Madison, Wis.

Pennsylvania Holstein breeders who cracked the top five in respective class competition were: Kerchenhill Holsteins, Kutztown, with a bull calf; M. Robert Young, Lancaster, with a junior yearling bull; Mowry Farms of Roaring Spring with a junior yearling bull; Reu-Hel Farms of Mohrsville with a senior yearling bull; Windy Mont Farm of Columbia Cross Roads with a senior yearling bull.

In heifer classes, Karpa Farm of Avella had a fourth place entry for senior calves; Upstream Farm of Easton placed third with a junior yearling; and Singing

Brook Farm of Imler was fourth with a senior yearling. Rowe Spring Farm of Chambersburg had a fifth place junior get with daughters of C Kenola Rocky.

Smithdale Farms of Shippensburg captured a second place ribbon with their entry in the 3 and 4 year old dry class. Burket Falls Farm of East Freedom had a second-place 2-year old, and a third-place for best udder. A 4-year old shown by Spring Lane Farm of Tyrone placed third, while Ni-Crete Barbara R Citation from Chambersburg placed fifth in the same class. Fred Strouse and Associates of Centre County placed third with an aged cow and also won the ribbon for third-best udder.

In group classes, Pennsylvania's Holstein herd placed fourth - behind New York, Ohio, and New England, in that order - and was followed by Maryland. Way-Bright Farms of Gettysburg captured a fourth place for daughter and dam and daughter pairs; Ni-Crete Farm and Burket Falls Farm placed fourth and fifth, respectively, for dairy herds, and Ni-Crete and Smithdale were third and fourth, respectively, for the best three females class.

Nearly 2200 prize dairy cattle from across the nation and Canada were shown during the 14th annual Pennsylvania All-American. The week-long event included six breeds.
