

## Comments sought on egg order

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U.S. Department of Agriculture is calling for comments on a proposal to amend regulations to the Egg Research and

Promotion Order. Under the proposed changes, producer-handlers must forward directly to the American Egg Board assessments on their nest-run (unsized and ungraded) eggs sold to other handlers. Producer-handlers still would be required to pay directly to the Board assessments on eggs that they grade, carton or break.

The time period in which producers can apply for a refund from the American Egg Board also would be changed. Under the proposal, refund applications would have to be

mailed within 90 days after the end of the calendar month during which the assessment is due and collectable. Presently, applications must be mailed within 90 days after the end of the calendar month during which the assessment is paid.

Comments on the proposal will be accepted until Oct. 26. They should be submitted in duplicate to the Hearing-Clerk, USDA, Room 1077-S, Washington, D.C. 20250 where they will be available for public inspection from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

## Hay needed in Md.

ANNAPOLIS, Md. - The Maryland Department of Agriculture's Division of Marketing is implementing a program entitled "Operation Maryland Haylift". Its purpose is to unite Maryland farmers who have hay or straw for sale with those in dire need in that commodity.

In order to alleviate the plight of those farmers with inadequate supplies, the MDA Division of Marketing is compiling a hay and straw directory. Currently, MDA marketing specialist Brad Powers is seeking farms where hay and straw are available. Persons with surplus stocks are asked to

notify him in writing by October 15. The letter should contain the person's name and address, including the county in which he resides, and a telephone number. Other pertinent facts should consist of what types hay and/or straw are for sale and the amount (bales, tons, etc.) being offered.

Letters of notification are to be mailed to "Operation Maryland Haylift", Maryland Department of Agriculture, Division of Marketing, Annapolis, Maryland 21401. There is no charge for the service, and the directory is scheduled for distribution to farmers later this Fall.
