BAIR - In a grand culmination of a year of diversified activities, York County 4-H'ers and their families gathered at the 4-H center at Bair for the annual Achievement Day.

Topping the two-hour presentation of awards and trophies was the naming of a king and queen to reign over 4-H activities and actively promote youth involvement.
