In the first clinic on energy saving, various methods of insulating for maximum comfort and fuel economy will be covered.

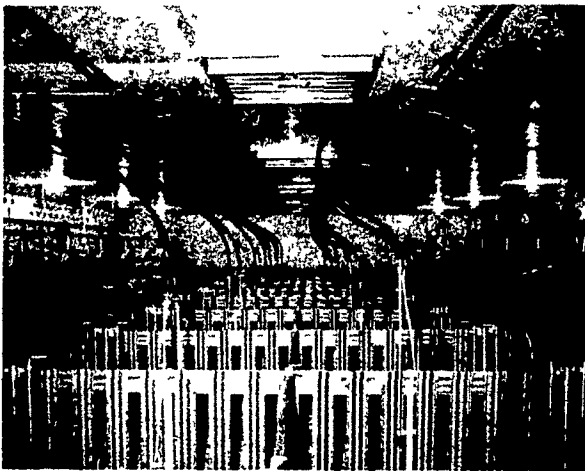
Other clinics will feature wall paneling, ceiling tile, wood finishing, and paint and wallpaper.
