

Wentz wins Baker scholarship

CARLISLE - Timothy Wentz, 17, of Carlisle R1, a freshman at The Pennsylvania State University majoring in animal science, has been named recipient of a \$200 Allen L. Baker 4-H Scholarship.

The award, presented annually to an outstanding Commonwealth 4-H member, is in memory of the late

Allen L. Baker who retired in 1958 from the Cooperative Extension Service staff after serving 38 years as State 4-H Club leader.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Alan B. Wentz, Timothy has been a 4-H member for five years.

A member of the Sheaffer 4-H Community Club and 4-H Light Horse and Pony Club,

he served as president, vice president, and treasurer. He also assisted with club activities and events as a teen leader.

The scholarship winner completed projects in horse, wood science, bicycle, corn, and veterinary science.

Locally, Timothy took part in the roundup, fund day, teen leader training, camp, exchange program, horse judging, and demonstration day.

He also participated in the Regional 4-H Teen Leaders Retreat, District 4-H Horse Show, Regional 4-H

Demonstration Day, State 4-H Achievement Days, Pennsylvania 4-H Leadership Congress, Farm Show, and the Citizenship Short Course.

He was named Cum-

berland County's Outstanding 4-H Boy in 1976; was 1977 state veterinary science contest winner in the 4-H National Awards Program; and won county medals in wood science, bicycle, and veterinary science.

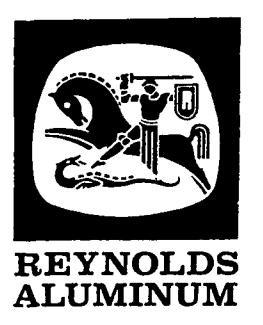
