HART - THE NEW WHEAT

Hart Wheat is a new variety, a high yielder, and a medium early type. It has very good straw, medium short in length and is a bearded wheat. The 1977 crop had a high test weight per bushel and averaged a 15 per cent increase in yield over Redcoat Wheat. Hart can be combined a few days ahead of Redcoat and is moderately resistant to Hessian Fly. Hart responds to fertilizer and management much like Redcoat. It is a wheat that you should check out.

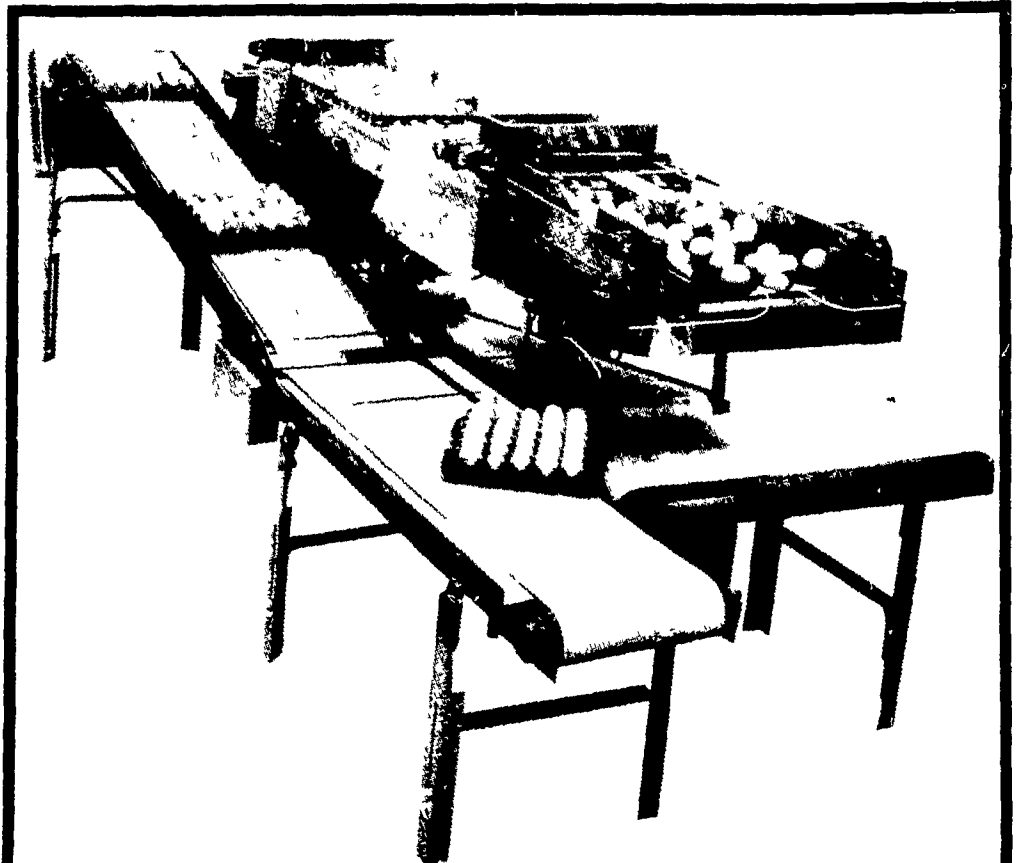
