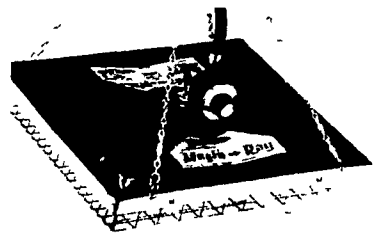
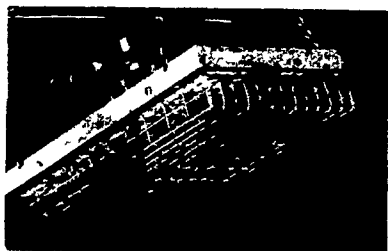

Sheep symposium planned

DENVER, Colo. -- A symposium on Sheep Production in Northeast has been scheduled for November 4 to 5, 1977 at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York. The symposium will feature speakers and producers from throughout New England.

A cooperative effort of the Sheep Industry Development Program and Cornell University, the symposium will be geared to sheep as the ideal profit alternative in the

Northeastern United States and will deal with modern management practices suited to the region.

Speakers from New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania and New England will cover a wide range of topics including pasture restoration in the Northeast, alfalfa management, record systems, reproductive physiology, methods of castration, producer case histories, early weaning and

utilization of electric fencing.

A highlight of the symposium will be a half day of practical demonstrations at Cornell's newly completed sheep research and teaching facility. The new unit features the latest in in-

tensive management facilities and equipment and automated feeded systems.

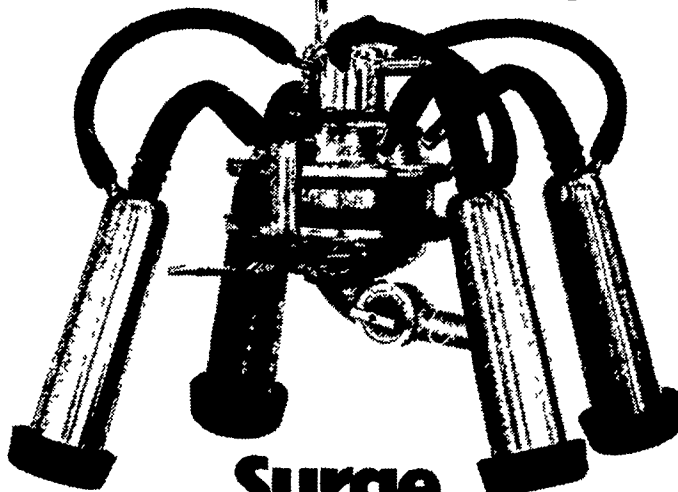
