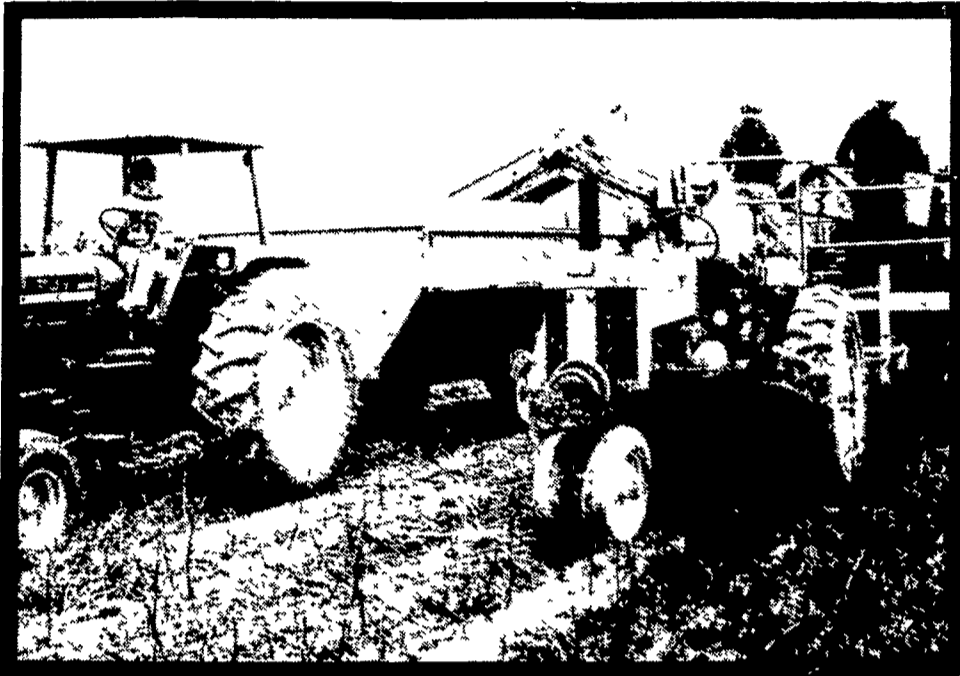


HERE'S WHAT FARMERS ARE SAYING ... ABOUT ORTHO UNIPEL FERTILIZER



"I farm about 200 acres with an average of 100 acres of potatoes each year. My fertilizer program was 1000 lbs/acre of Ortho Unipel 16-16-16 this past year. Yields are running about 260-270 cwt. My soils are beginning to be built up extremely high in phosphorus and medium in potash, according to my Penn State soil test. I'm going to concentrate on using more potash and less phosphorus next year. I am planning to use new Ortho Unipel 21-7-14 at 800 lbs/acre next year to build my potash levels. The biggest thing I like about a unipel is its uniformity where a pellet contains nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium in the desired ratio for my potatoes; whereas a custom blend doesn't feed my potatoes uniformly because the N, P, and K are in separate pellets."

"I have been using Ortho Unipels since 1962. Last year my fertilizer program was 150 lbs/per acre of Unipel 13-34-10 at planting time and 400 lbs/per acre of Ortho Ammonium Nitrate. My yield last year was 170 Bu/per acre. I like Ortho 13-34-10 because it flows through the planter box easier than blends, and I get no caking of fertilizer with Unipels in my planter."

"We farm 145 acres and have been using Ortho Unipels for 6 years. Our fertilizer program is Unipel 20-10-10 at 700 lbs/acre with Unipel 13-34-10 corn starter at 150 lbs/acre. My fertilizer program is 500 lbs/acre of Unipel 20-10-10 in the spring plus 125 lbs/acre of Unipel 13-34-10 with supplemental nitrogen in the form of 28% at 100 lbs/acre. I could actually see where the blended fertilizers segregated in the fields resulting in uneven distribution. Unipels flow real well in our spreaders. We have also found that Unipels spread better in our potato planter."
