The high herd for September was David Stewart's, Delta, R1, producing 55.6 lbs. milk and 2.24 lbs. butterfat on 56 cows. Second high was Sinking Spring Farm, York, with 64 cows producing 54.1 lbs. milk and 2.12 lbs. butterfat.

The high cow was Harriet, a 6-year old registered Holstein producing 23,046 lbs. milk and 918 lbs. butterfat. She is owned by Hidden Spring Farms, Dover. Second high was Nomi, an 8-year old registered Holstein owned by Beshore Farms, New Cumberland. She produced 25,432 lbs. milk and 907 lbs. B.F.

## Inspectors paid \$20

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U.S. Department of Agriculture said it will increase its fees for inspection and grading of manufactured or processed dairy products on Nov. 6. The increases are needed to bring charges in line with increased operating costs, including salary increases authorized by Congress, according to Carol Tucker Foreman, assistant secretary of agriculture for food and consumer services.

The charge for inspection and grading services performed between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. (day services) will be increased from \$18.20 to \$19 and services between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m. (night services) from \$20 per hour to \$21. The hourly charges for laboratory services will be increased from \$19.30 to \$20.30.

The hourly rates for continuous resident services are being increased from \$14 to \$15.60 for the inspector or grader in charge and from \$12 to \$13.60 for the assistant inspector or grader. The hourly fees for continuous non-resident service are being increased from \$25 to \$25.80 for day services and from \$26.80 to \$27.80 for night services.

Grading and inspection of dairy products is a voluntary service, provided on request. The Agricultural Marketing Act of 1946 provides that USDA collect fees approximately equal to the cost of rendering the service.

## Meat production varied

HARRISBURG - Red meat production in Pennsylvania during September 1977 totaled 91.7 million pounds, up nearly one per cent from a year earlier, according to the Crop Reporting Service. Cattle slaughter at 87,900 head was down three per cent from September 1976; calf slaughter at 34,900 head was down twenty per cent; sheep and lambs slaughter at 12,500 head were down six

per cent; and hog slaughter at 245,900 head was up four per cent from a year ago.

Nationally, commercial red meat production in September totaled 3.4 billion pounds, down three per cent from a year earlier. Cattle slaughter was down five per cent, calf slaughter was down four per cent, sheep and lambs slaughter was down nine per cent, and hog slaughter increased from September 1976.

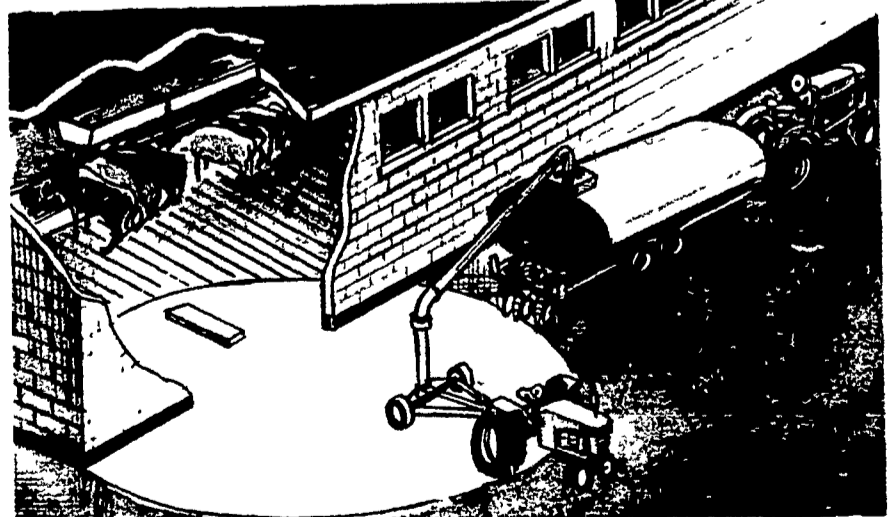
