

Kase wins national 4-H award

UNIVERSITY PARK — Kevin Kase, 18, of Danville, who last month was named state winner in the entomology category of the National 4-H Awards Program, was selected as a northeastern United States sectional winner.

Kevin will receive an expense-paid trip to National 4-H Congress in Chicago, November 27 to December 1, provided by Hercules Incorporated. He also will compete for awards at the national level.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Kase, Kevin is a sophomore at Clarion State College. He has been a 4-H member for 10 years.

A member of the Valley 4-H Club, he served as president, treasurer, and game leader. He also served

as a teen leader for the entomology members.

The sectional entomology contest winner completed projects in entomology, geology, gardening, cooking, landscaping, teen leadership, and theater arts.

In Montour County, he was involved in the 4-H roundup, kick-off party, demonstration day, camp, and achievement night.

He also participated in the Regional 4-H Teen Leaders Retreat, Pennsylvania 4-H Leadership Congress, State 4-H Achievement Days, and State 4-H Capital Days.

He was named as one of the Outstanding 4-H Boys in the State, won the 4-H "I Dare You" Award, and received county medals in entomology, public speaking, leadership, and achievement.
