GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. November 9, 1977

The market is firm. Slaughter schedules moderate. Ready-to-cook demand good with some inquiry unfilled for delivery this week. Little asking prices are mostly 39 cents for plant grade and 40 cents for U.S. Grade A. Live supply barely adequate to short and average weights light to desirable.

Current broiler/fryer negotiated prices for immediate delivery-including multiple-drop shipments to New York City from Delmarva.

Range: US Grade A 39-41; Plant Grade 38-39½ Premium X US Grade A 46; Premium X Plant Grade 44.

Wtd. Avg: US Grade A 39.35; Plant Grade 38.36; Premium X US Grade A 46.00; Premium X Plant Grade 44.00.

Eastern Pa. & N.J. Poultry

November 9, 1977

Prices slightly higher as offerings decrease and plants attempt to maintain running time, however, canner prices are holding steady. Demand for heavy hens is improving as the holidays approach. Prices are unchanged at 22½-23 cents. Delivered plant.

Prices paid at farm: Light type hens: 8-10, mostly 9½; f.o.b. plant: 11½-12½ mostly 11½-12.

PACMA Facts

The following market is supplied by PACMA-FACTS, a direct marketing organization affiliated with the Pennsylvania Farmers' Association. Participating poultrymen are members of PACMA, which employs a fowl marketing agent - The Farmers' Agricultural Cooperative Trading Society (FACT) - to sell members' fowl. PACMA works directly with the PFA poultrymen in the program.

Farm point prices prevailing for fowl to be marketed by members during the Week of October 17 were 10½ cents at farm weight, 12½ cents at plant weight.

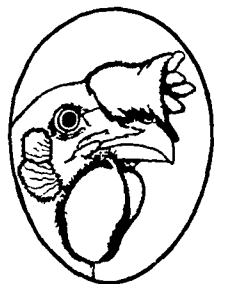
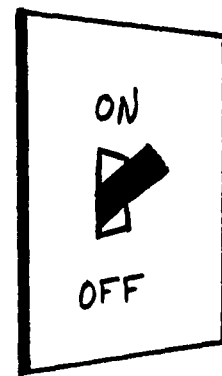
