



## Berks COUNTY DHIA MONTHLY REPORT

SEPTEMBER 1977

An 8-year old Holstein named Faith left no doubt that she was tops in Berks County for lactations completed in September. Owned by Charles Plushanski, the registered Holstein rocketed out in front with a record of 32,176 pounds of milk and 1601 of butterfat. Her closest competitor on both counts was Nora 36, owned by Floyd Weber. Her record amounted to 25,286 pounds of milk and 968 of butterfat.
