No-till conference set

COCKEYSVILLE, Md. - The Fourth Annual Mid-Atlantic No-Till Conference will be held on January 5, 1978 at Hunt Valley Inn, Cockeysville, Md. The day long conference will start at 10 00 a.m. with a team presentation by Robert Raver, Montgomery County, Md., Extension agent, and Joseph Newcomer, retired University of Maryland agronomist on "Managing Your No-Till Problems". A panel discussion on "Practices Which Reduce Weed Problems in No-Till Corn" will feature Ralph MacGregor, East Berlin, Pa, farmer, Dave Sparks, farmer from Upperco, Md., and D. Willard of Willard Chemical Co., Frederick, Md. The panel moderator will be York County Extension agent, John Smith.

The afternoon program will feature FMC Manager of Technical Services, Armand Padula discussing "No-Till Corn Insects."

"Supplying Nitrogen to No-Till Corn" will be the topic of Merle Teele, University of Delaware agronomist. Clarence Palmby, vice president, public affairs, Continental Grain Company, will conclude the conference with an address on "How Farmers Can Improve Their Strength in Marketing."

Before and after the conference, attending farmers will be able to visit and talk with over 20 commercial company representatives in the exhibit hall. Admission to this year's conference will be by ticket only. Tickets may be purchased at the Adams County Cooperative Extension Service office, Gettysburg, Pa., for \$2 per person before December 19, 1977.

The Mid-Atlantic No-Till Conference is sponsored by the Cooperative Extension Services in Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, Virginia, and West Virginia in cooperation with participating agri-businesses.
