

75 Lancaster County farmers named to ASC offices

LANCASTER — A total of 75 Lancaster County farmers were elected to offices on 15 Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation community committees Wednesday.

The five committeemen in each of the ASC units administer federal farm programs in their respective township communities.

Elected in the annual mail balloting were a chairman, vice chairman, a regular member and a first and second alternate.

The chairman, vice chairman and regular committee member from each of the 15 communities will represent their respective as delegates to the Lancaster County ASC Convention on Dec. 15.

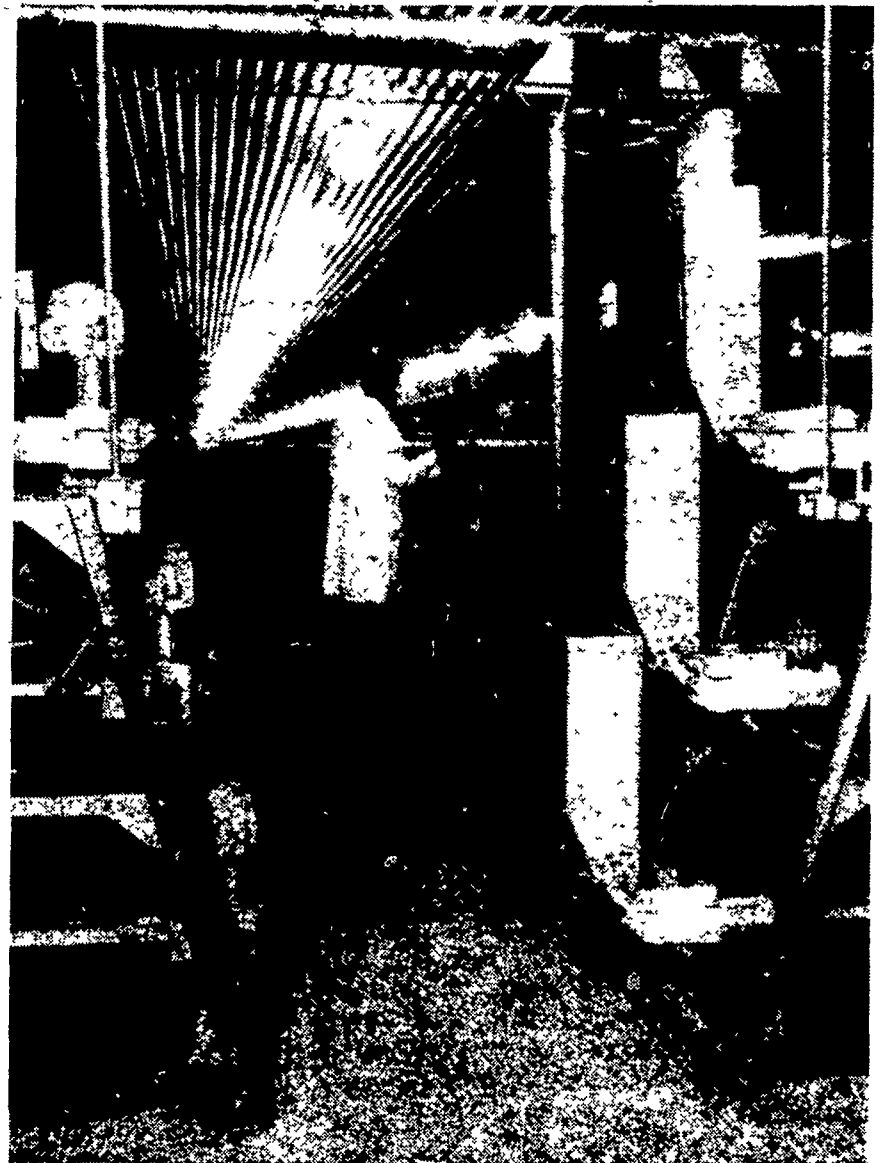
