 2 3/4 cups flour
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
 1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon
 1/2 teaspoon cloves
 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
 1/2 cup milk
 1 1/2 cups dates or raisins
 1 cup nuts
 Mix shortening, brown sugar, and eggs, then add remaining ingredients, working each into mixture. When all are well mixed,

drop by teaspoons onto cookie sheet and bake at 350°F. for ten minutes.

 1/2 teaspoon baking soda

CRANBERRY BREAD

2 cups flour
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
 1 cup granulated sugar
 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
 1 beaten egg
 Juice of one orange, grated
 Juice of one orange plus enough water to equal 2/3 cup liquid
 1/2 cup chopped nuts
 1 cup quartered fresh cranberries
 Mix together dry ingredients except nuts and cranberries. Mix together liquid ingredients. Mix both dry and liquid together and add nuts and cranberries to mixture. Bake at 350°F. for one hour in greased and papered loaf pan. Test with toothpick for being done. Age in cool place for several days before serving. Yield is one large loaf. The recipe can be doubled for three small loaves.
