When Anne returns from the Farm Show next week, you can be sure she will have many new ideas to translate into a winning 4-H garment for next year.



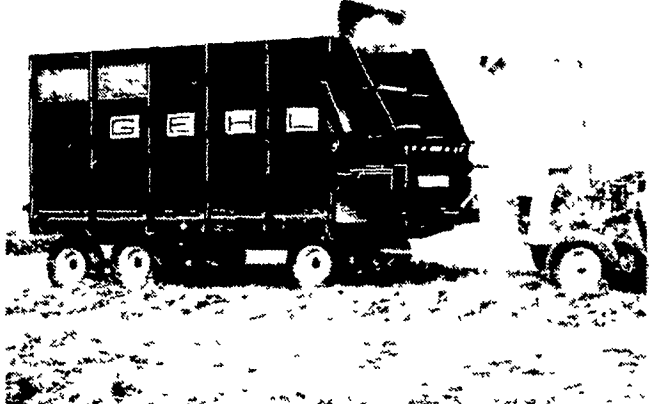
