A second win on Thursday for Gruber came when one of his animals was also named champion reserve heavyweight. This animal was second in rank to the heavyweight which became reserve gr - champion, overall.

Greg Strice vho showed the reserve ciamp, overall, was fire named heavyweight division champion with his 239 pound Duroc crossbred gilt. At nine years old this is Greg's first year at showing. He is a member of the Berks County 4-H Swine Club, and he is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Gene Stricker.

Taking the championship of the light heavyweight division was Jay Bomgardner, Annville, with a homebred 226 pound Hampshire. Three days previous to the Thursday market hog competition, Jay's brother Charles had earned top honors in Hampshire breeding swine competition. The two brothers are in partnership, along with a third brother, in Blue Mountain View Farms.

Jay, who is president of the Lebanon County 4-H Livestock Club, has never even had a first placing in the market swine competition, prior to this although he also had a champion bred gilt last year.

Happy with his accomplishment, the youth admitted that he had aimed for the market hog title this year, and while he didn't garner the overall championship, he was pleased to go as far as he did.

Another area title winner was Tony Eberly, Denver R2, from Cloister FFA of Ephrata High School, who showed the middleweight reserve champion.
