Three USDA agencies merged

WASHINGTON, — The U.S. Department of Agriculture has created a new agency, the Economics, Statistics, and Cooperatives Service (ESCS), by the merger of the Economic Research Service, the Statistical Reporting Service, and the Farmer Cooperative Service, Secretary of Agriculture Bob Bergland announced recently.

"Our research efforts on the economics of agriculture, our research on cooperatives, and the reporting of agricultural statistical information are closely related," Secretary Bergland said. "The merger will enhance coordination of these activities and make the entire operation more efficient."

designated Kenneth R. Farrell, formerly deputy administrator of the Economic Research Service, to be acting ESCS administrator. The new agency reports directly to USDA's director of economics, policy analysis, and budget, Howard W. Hjort.

Some of the key functions of the new agency are to: —Provide economic analysis on domestic and international agricultural supply and demand; on food supplies and prices, nutrition and labeling; on

the production distribution and marketing of agricultural products; on the management of natural resources, and on development of rural communities and the welfare of rural people.

—Collect and report statistical information on U.S. agriculture, including estimates of crop and livestock production, demand and supply.

—Provide research and technical assistance on the economic and marketing aspects of cooperatives.

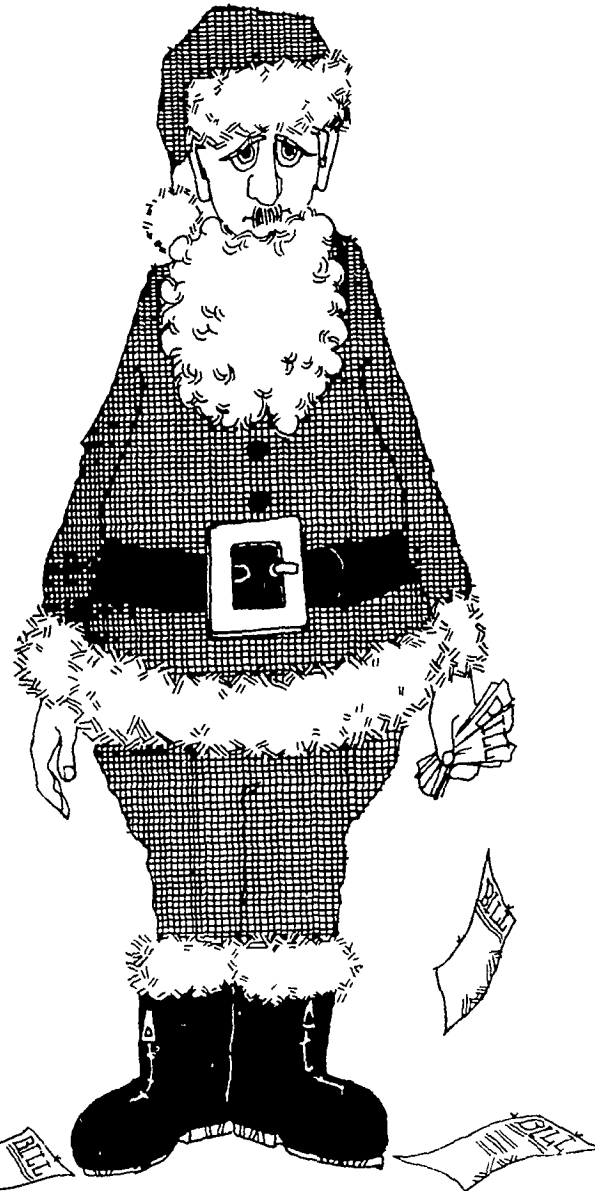
Farm and Home Foundation meets
