

Dog licenses overdue

HARRISBURG — State Agriculture Secretary Kent Shelhamer urged Pennsylvania dog owners to purchase a 1978 dog license for their pets.

Under the Pennsylvania Dog Law Act of 1965, all dogs six months or older must be licensed no later than January 15 of each year. The

Agriculture Department's Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement is responsible for the enforcement of the act.

Shelhamer expressed his concern that many Pennsylvanians neglect to buy licenses for their dogs. He said that last year, less than one million of the state's estimated two and one half

million dog population were licensed.

Shelhamer said that more than 66,000 stray dogs had to be humanely disposed of last year in Pennsylvania, adding that many were someone's lost pet. "Licensing could have prevented the loss of many of these dogs. If you love your dog, license it," he added.

The Agriculture Secretary noted that he hoped that at least half of the state's dog population could be licensed this year. Licenses cost \$1.20 for males and spayed

females, and \$2.20 for females. Dog licenses for 1978 are still available and may be purchased from the County Treasurer's Office in the County Courthouse, or from an authorized agent

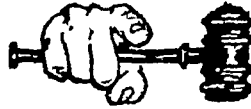
