Boat registries due

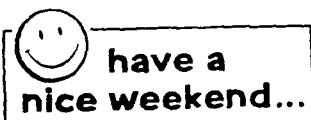
HARRISBURG — Rep. Noah Wenger, R-Lancaster, reminds Pennsylvania motorboat owners that the Pennsylvania Fish Commission is now handling registrations instead of the Department of Revenue as in previous years.

Wenger said the address to which renewal application requests should be returned is Fish Commission, P.O. Box 1852, Harrisburg, Pa. 17120.

Boat owners are also reminded that the law requires notification of change of address within 15 days.

Wenger said validated registration cards and decals will be mailed in late January and may be used upon receipt. The 1977 registration cards are invalid after March 31, 1978.

"If you have just bought a boat and have not registered it as of yet, you must immediately apply for a registration form at the Fish Commission or purchase one at any boating store that carries boat registration forms if you wish to take to the waterways when the weather will permit," he added.



Shaver is number one

CAMBRIDGE, Ont. — Shaver Poultry Breeding Farms, Ltd., with headquarters in this Canadian town, is at the top of a random USDA sample test determining highest net income over feed and chick costs.

This year ranked the 11th time in 13 years, and the eighth consecutive year that the Shaver Ross 288 bird earned the highest report over all entries in the USDA Random Sample Test Two Year Summary.

The Shaver 288 beat the rest of the flock with a net income over feed and chick costs figure of \$5.71. Eggs per hen housed stood at 260 and pounds of feed per pound of eggs was pegged at 2.37. Ounces per dozen eggs averaged 26.2.

Second in the summary, compiled in January of 1978, is the Babcock B300V, followed by the Babcock B300F, and Hisex in that order.
