Farm prices are up, but so are farm costs

WASHINGTON, D.C. — High prices for cattle, hogs, broilers, lettuce, and tomatoes helped push the January Index of Prices Received by Farmers up four points — two per cent — over December figures, the U.S. Department of Agriculture revealed this week.

The price increase, says USDA, was the fourth consecutive upward movement in the index.

Meanwhile, the Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for commodities and services, interest, taxes, and farm wages rates moved up by four points. As a result the ratio of prices received to prices paid remained unchanged. It stands at 89 for January of this year, compared with 92 points for January of 1977.

The Parity Ratio, says USDA, now stands at 65, down one point from the year before.
