

Red Rose Dairy Day slated

LANCASTER — An informative program for Lancaster County dairymen will get underway here March 7 at the Farm and Home Center. It's Lancaster County Dairy Day, and it'll begin at 9 a.m. and continue through mid-afternoon.

Aside from numerous educational presentations (see schedule in latter parts of this article), a number of local dairy equipment dealers and suppliers will have exhibits and displays on hand for inspection and study. A complete lunch will be available at a cost of \$1.25 per person.
