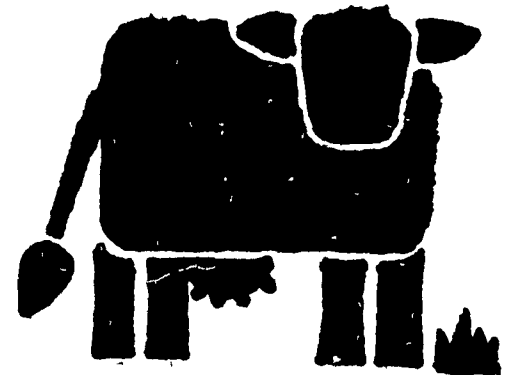
Special awards were also presented to outstanding 4-H'ers and friends of 4-H. Outstanding Food and
