I'm glad our sixth and youngest child is working on making this motor, because

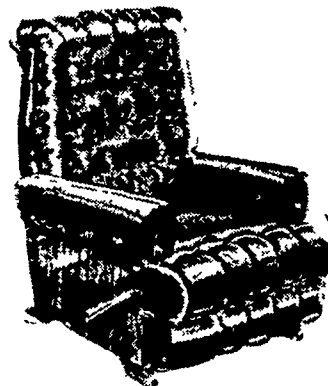
