Cows and bulls near 12 per cent of the cattle receipts, feeder near 88 per cent of the total.

Fire ants are small and reddish-brown and measure about 1/8th to 1/4th inch long. The ants build mounds that may average 15 inches or more in diameter and 10 to 12 inches in height. There may be as many as 30 to 50 mounds per acre. Around

stumps, shrubs or posts, mounds may reach a height of three feet. When the mound is disturbed, hundreds of ants boil out and swarm over the intruder in seconds. Their painful, burning sting is followed by a pustule that can leave a scar like chicken pox.

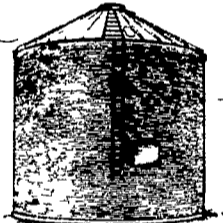

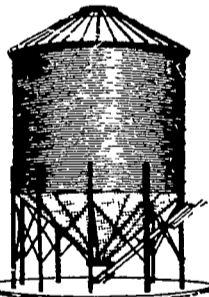

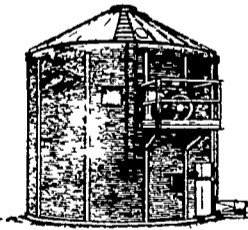
