

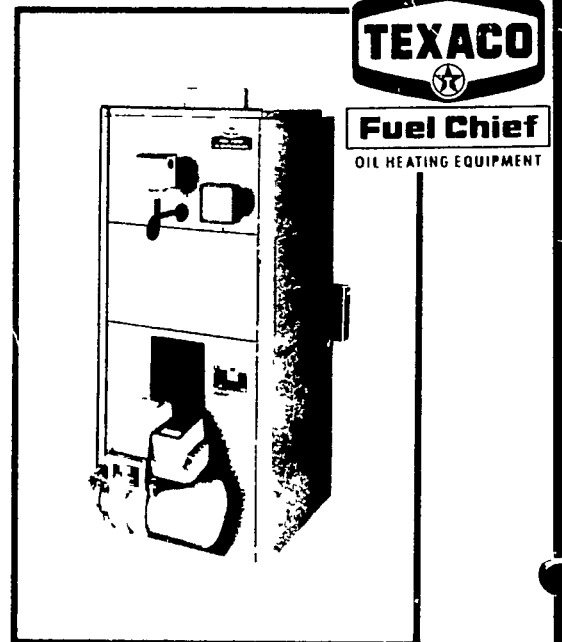

# Mg 14

- 1) **ADVANCED PREGNANCY** — The intake must supply Magnesium for two animals
- 2) **EARLY LACTATION** — During this period a 2-day flow of milk will remove all of the Magnesium in the blood
