bid a lamb up to \$42 and a ewe/lamb pair to \$100. Of course, the bidding could have gone on for several more minutes, but Jugan sold the animal prematurely to keep the price realistic.

After each hour demonstration, Jugan also answers questions from the group. At the playschool, those questions included: "Are you going to shave the little lamb?" to "Does the mother get cold when you shave her?" to "What's that stuff you put on your clippers?" Following each inquiry, Jugan responds willingly.

After 10 years, Jugan knows what to expect, for the most part, although something new can pop up any time. Last week Jugan did six demonstrations in schools and said that he travels anywhere from Kimberton to Allentown to Reading to Montgomery to Bucks counties. He's also been doing work with intermediate units, and feels that these "special" children have a lot to benefit from the program.

But, anyone, really, can gain knowledge from his program. So, for this farmer/real estate agent/auctioneer/educator, the time involved is well spent.

Skating party set for Sun.


HARRISBURG – An open roller skating party is being sponsored by the Dauphin County 4-H Clubs on April 23.
