Nutrition experiments noted

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J., - Seven U.S. Department of Agriculture scientists have reported results of nutrition studies dealing with lowcopper diets, high-fiber diets, iron compounds and cement dust.

The scientists, from USDA's Science and Education Administration, reported their research results at the annual meeting of the Federation of American Societies for Experimental Biology held recently.

SEA scientists Leslie M. Klevay and biochemist Kenneth G.D. Allen of the University of North Dakota found diets low in copper may intensify the risk of coronary heart disease, the leading cause of death in the United States. The scientists, working at the SEA Human Nutrition Laboratory, Grand Forks, N.D., found that laboratory

rats on a low-copper and cholesterol-free diet had higher concentrations of cholesterol in blood plasma than rats on a copper-

supplemented control diet. New research findings reported by June L. Kelsay raised questions about present recommendations for some nutrients when a high-fiber diet is eaten. When the 12 men volunteers

were eating the high-fiber diet, Dr. Kelsay said, their bodies lost more calcium, magnesium and silicon than they ate. Some iron was retained under both the highfiber and low-fiber diets. The men retained more carotene under the low fiber diet than under the high-fiber diet.

Dr. Kelsay is a SEA research nutritionist. The University of Maryland

cooperated in the study at studies, Edward R. the Nutrition Institute at Beltsville. SEA research nutritionist Kay M. Behall reported the same study showed that serum levels of triglycerides, free fatty acids, cholesterol, glucose, lactate, insulin, growth-hormone, cortisol and phosphorus were not significantly affected by increasing the fiber content of the diet.

In animal nutrition

Roginski, an SEA research biologist, found young rats which were fed dust from a Georgia cement factory gained weight 23 per cent faster than rats getting the same diet without the dust. Dr. Roginski said the kiln dust had previously given big growth boosts to cattle. The research was done at the Nutrition Institute at Beltsville.

Eugene R. Morris an SEA for rats.

research chemist at Beltsville, reported on results of feeding dogs monoferric phytate, an iron compound found in wheat bran. When fed with a standard meal, he found, the compound was about as effective as other iron sources tested.

Rex Ellis, also a research chemist at Beltsville, described a process for treating wheat bran to make it an excellent source of zinc
