Family diets low in vitamins

UNIVERSITY PARK - Studies show that families get less than the recommended dietary allowances for certain nutrients.

Each person needs four servings every day of foods rich in vitamins A and C, says Louise Hamilton, professor of food science Extension and author of Penn State's correspondence course on Meal Planning for Young Homemakers. These four servings should include one food rich in vitamin C. one that is a good source of vitamin A at least every other day, and two or three other fruits or vegetables daily.

If one follows these recommended allowances, you and your family members should have a diet that supplies adequate amounts of vitamins C and A. Now how about calcium? Children to age nine need two to three cups of milk or a substitute every

day; children nine to 12 need three to four cups of milk every day. Teenagers need four cups every day; adults need two cups every day (more during pregnancy and lactation).

Other lessons in the course are directed toward planning and serving of nutritious meals, making the best use of time and money, how to help husbands and children develop good food habits, and learning to evaluate sources for accurate nutrition information.




