WHAT'S NEW

BALER

A new, beefed-up heavy-duty baler from Sperry New Holland is tailored for the special needs of irrigated alfalfa producers. Designated the Model 430, the new 16 by 18 baler has the added strength to enable it to handle the stresses of crossing irrigation ditches and borders on a continuous basis, says New Holland. A special feature is a heavier, stronger axle that minimizes stresses and easily carries the baler in rough terrain.

Bale shape and density have been improved by the use of an adjustable feeder back and the addition of four hay restrictor doors on the bale chamber sides as auxiliaries to the upper and lower tension rails.

The improved bale density and shape control of the "430" reduce handling problems where these large-capacity balers are teamed with automatic bale handling equipment.

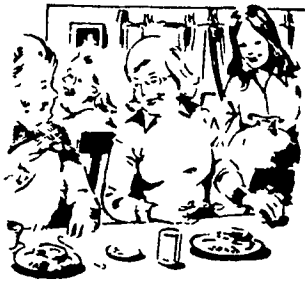
will be served from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. Tickets also available at the door.

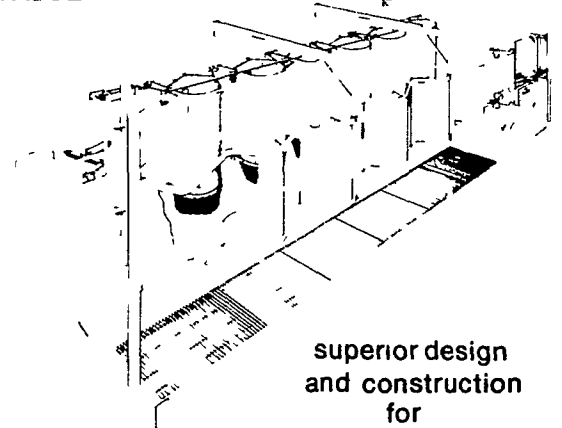
