## 20% of wheat/feed grain farms enrolled in ASCS programs

WASHINGTON - A total of 455,023 wheat and feed grain farms were enrolled at the end of the first seven weeks of sign-up for the 1978 Wheat and Feed Grain Programs, according to Ray Fitzgerald, administrator of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS). The 455,023 farms represent 19.8 per cent of the 2,299,963 wheat and feed grain farms in the U.S. State ASC Chairperson Louise Rinker reported 4936 Pennsylvania farmers enrolled during this period.

No information is available for this initial report on the wheat grazing option or the feed grain and cotton additional diversion provisions. This information will be included in later sign-up reports.

The signed up farms intend to plant or have planted 20,390,278 acres of wheat and 23,632,893 acres of feed grains. Cropland to be set aside by the participating farms totaled 6,441,345 acres. This does not include additional acreage signed up under the feed grain and

cotton voluntary diversion provisions. Feed grains eligible for the 1978 program are barley, corn, and sorghum.

Participating farms have 82,384,161 acres of normal crop acreage (NCA), 31.5 per cent of the total NCA of 261,469,645 acres for the U.S.

Participation in the set-aside program is voluntary. However, non-participants are not eligible for price support loans, disaster payments or deficiency (target price) payments.

Sign-up began March 1 and will continue through May 15. A progress report will be issued each Tuesday until sign-up is completed.

Farmers who sign up and indicate their planting and

set-aside intentions will not be held to the figures they provide ASCS during the sign-up period. Final figures will be available after farmers have "certified" their planted acreage later in the year.

Minimum acreage sign-up makes farmers eligible for price support on grain crops, program disaster benefits, and price deficiency payments if 1978-79 prices are below program targets.

Additional feed grain acreage equal to 10 per cent of the planted feed grain crop entitled producers to cash additional payments based on the acreage being grown for harvest. Set-aside acreage will not be harvested in 1978.

## Ornamental nursery course offered

UNIVERSITY PARK - Personnel trained in the propagation, field production, use and maintenance of trees, shrubs and flowers are in demand by landscape and production nurserymen and garden center operators.

The Ornamental Nursery Management Winter Course of Penn State provides training in identification, propagation, nursery production and management, landscape use and design, and maintenance of trees, shrubs, annual and perennial flowers. The management of greenhouses and other forcing structures is also included in the instruction.

The noncredit course consists of two eight week terms a year in each of two years. The six months summer period between the second and third terms is used for on-the-job training.

High School graduates who are interested in working with plants and in home improvement are eligible to enroll.

The instruction is on the main campus of Penn State with regular staff members providing the instruction.
