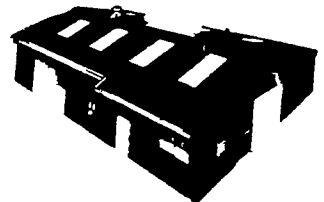

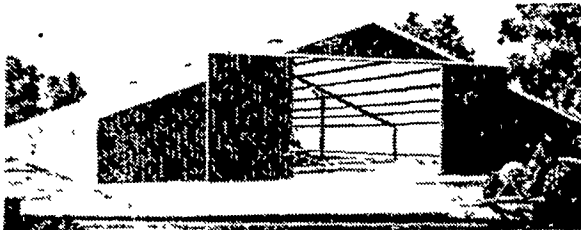

\$24,100 tractor pull coming to Grantville

GRANTVILLE -- An NTPA tractor pulling contest to be held here this Summer is one of three pulls to be added to the NTPA's Summer Circuit, bringing the total up to 34 events during the period between the end of May and the end of September. NTPA is the National Tractor Pullers Association.

The newly added pulls are: The Muncy Chief-Penn National State Fair Tractor Pull in Grantville, the Colorado State Cham-

pionships at Greeley, Colo.; and the Saratoga Nationals in Saratoga, N.Y.

The Grantville event will be held on May 29 and 30 at the Penn National State Fair at the Penn National Race Course just off I-81, 20 miles northeast of Harrisburg. The two day event is being co-sponsored by Muncy Chief Hybrids, a major NTPA awards sponsor from Muncy. This event is the second pull of the Summer circuit, and is the first Region I event, a Class B event for \$24,100 in purses.

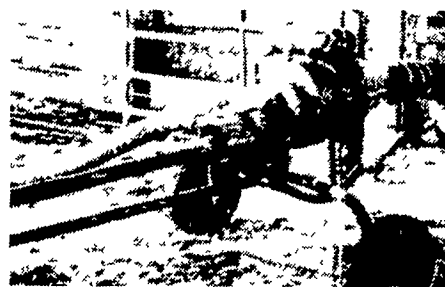
