#### **BIRD OF PARADISE**

- 1 broiler-fryer chicken, cut in parts
- 3 cup orange juice
- 1/3 cup soy sauce

In large shallow baking pan place chicken, skin side up, in single layer. In bowl mix orange juice and sov sauce. Pour over chicken. Bake, uncovered, in 325°F. oven, basting and turning every 15 minutes about 11/2 hours or until fork can be inserted in chicken with ease. Remove chicken from basting sauce to serve. Makes four servings.

STEAMED CHICKEN 1 whole broiler-fryer chicken 2 tablespoons salt

2 tablespoons ginger powder 2 tablespoons dry sherry In bowl mix salt and ginger. Rub on chicken. Let

stand in refrigerator 30 minutes. Brush off excess salt and ginger. Place chicken in bowl. Arrange bowl on rack in container in which water is placed below rack. Cover whole container and steam 30 minutes. Remove chicken; cut with cleaver into smaller pieces. Reserve two tablespoons broth from bowl in which chicken was steamed. Add sherry to reserved broth. Place chicken on serving platter. Sprinkle sherry mixture over chicken. Makes four servings.
