

Ben Morgan retires

science degree in animal husbandry from West Virginia University.

As Penn State Extension animal scientist, Morgan played a major role in the development of the Pennsylvania Livestock and Allied Industries Association. He worked closely with this organization in the formation of the Keystone International Livestock Exposition, and served as the Exposition's manager

from 1958-63 and later as chairman.

He was instrumental in the reorganization of the Pennsylvania Sheep and Wool Growers' Association, placing major emphasis on production improvement, orderly marketing, and promotion of the consumer's acceptance of quality lamb and wool.

Morgan is responsible for the Extension sheep program, including lamb and wool marketing. Pennsylvania cooperative wool pools annually market

about 80 per cent of the Commonwealth's production.

Since 1962, the retiring animal scientist assisted in directing Extension's beef cattle breeding program, beef performance testing program, and graded feeder calf and cattle sales. Under his guidance, these sales have increased from four to 12 in the state.

A promotor of an integrated progeny testing program, professor Morgan was active in the establishment of the Pennsylvania Meat Animal Evaluation Center and served on its executive

committee since its inception. Working with purebred beef cattle breeders, a bull testing program was developed and has been integrated into the functions of the Center.

He represented Pennsylvania in the formation of the Beef Improvement Federation, a national organization designed to standardize beef performance testing programs throughout the United States and Canada.

As livestock specialist, he assisted in developing and conducting many in-depth sheep and beef cattle breeding, feeding, and management clinics and short courses.

In 1971 he was granted a sabbatical leave to investigate the beef and sheep industries in New Zealand and Australia. While on leave, he was invited to present a lecture at New Zealand's annual meeting of the Society of Animal Production. Information gathered during his leave was presented to over 110 livestock producer and industry meetings.

He serves as advisor to numerous state, regional, and national livestock organizations. He also is author of many livestock publications, 4-H project books, and feature articles.

In recognition of his outstanding contributions to the nation's livestock industry, Professor Morgan was named an Honorary Fellow of the American Society of Animal Science in 1976.

He was named Pennsylvania's Livestock Man of the Year in 1975 and received Gamma Sigma Delta society's Extension Award in 1974. While serving in West Virginia he received

a Distinguished Service Award from the National Association of County Agricultural Agents.

The retiring professor is a member of the American Society of Animal Science, Extension Professors' Association, and Epsilon Sigma Phi and Gamma Sigma Delta societies.

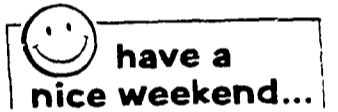
He is married to the former Ruth McClintic, of Frankford, W. Va. They are the parents of two daughters.

Cheap wheels

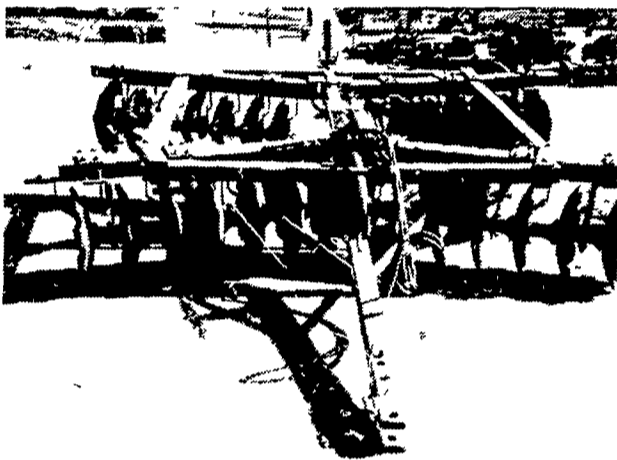

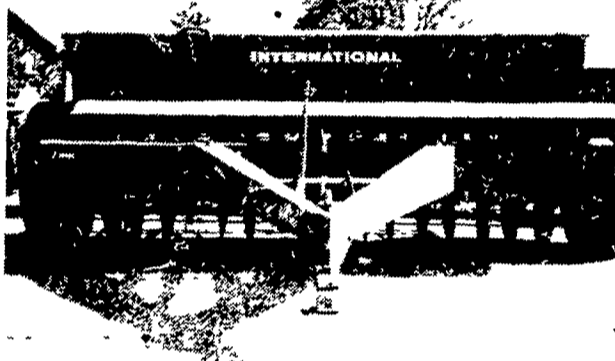

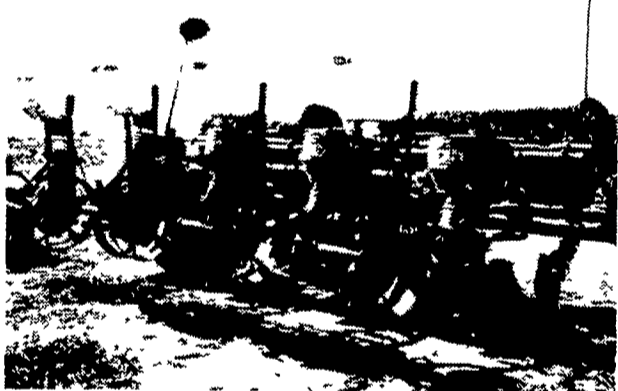
