They also supported S.B. 1385, Printers No. 1751, to amend the Capital budget of 1973-74 to provide for additional funds for the repair of damages of the snow to the present Farm Show Complex, provide additional funds for necessary modification as required for housing horses and beef cattle, and improve and light the parking lot. They likewise suported S.B. 1439.

Printers No. 1818, which permit would municipality to make emergency repairs to any State Highway located within the municipality with the Commonwealth reimbursing the municipality for actual costs of repair.


Seminar speaker named




