

Fulton Grange meets

QUARRYVILLE — Fulton Grange met in regular session May 22, at the Grange Hall, Oakryn. Mrs. William Rhoades, lecturer, presented the program with Emidio Parenti, Protective Services, Lancaster Co. Office Of Aging, and James Mullahan, field representative, Social Security Administration, Lancaster, were the speakers.

Parenti explained the roll of services provided by the Lancaster Co. Office Of The Aging which is supported by the federal, state and local funds.

Mullahan explained the Social Security set-up concerning necessary payments to the fund,

requirements when requesting assistance when recipients are near retirement age or forced into medical disability retirement and answered many questions. He said Lancaster Countians may secure birth certificates by Writing to Bureau of Health, New Castle, Pa.

Edward L. Zug, master, conducted the business session when the Grange supported the following legislation in the Pa. Legislature; H.B. 406, Printers No. 2926, which would require members of the General Assembly to adopt or reject the recommendations of the Commonwealth Compensation

Commission within 15 legislative days; H.B. 1377, Printers No. 1739, to amend the Tax Reform Code of 1971 to provide for family farm corporations exemption of the Capitol Stock Tax; and House Resolution 208, Printers No. 2924, which would support the passage by Congress of the Emergency Highway and Transportation Repair Act of 1978 (H.R. 10979).

They also supported S.B. 1385, Printers No. 1751, to amend the Capital budget of 1973-74 to provide for additional funds for the repair of damages of the snow to the present Farm Show Complex, provide additional funds for necessary modification as required for housing horses and beef cattle, and improve and light the parking lot. They likewise supported S.B. 1439,

Printers No. 1818, which would permit any municipality to make emergency repairs to any State Highway located within the municipality with the Commonwealth reimbursing the municipality for actual costs of repair. Fulton Grange presented the Pa. State Grange traveling flags to Kennett Grange 19, Chester Co., at their meeting May 24.

In observance of June Dairy Month, Fulton Grange will have their annual home-made ice cream and strawberry party at the next meeting on June 12. This will also be the Lancaster Co. Pomona visitation meeting when Salisbury, Colerain, and Fulton Granges will present the program on the theme of "Lancaster County's Contribution To The Building Of The State."

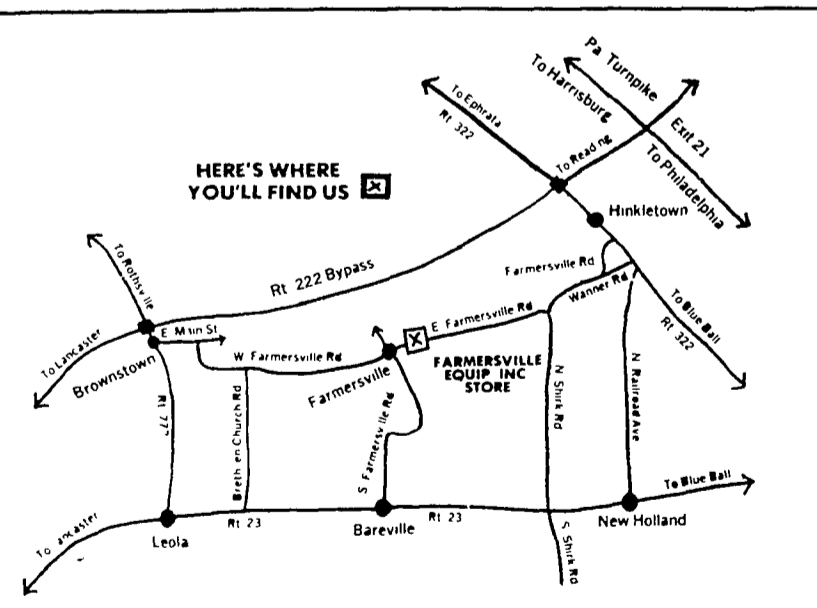
