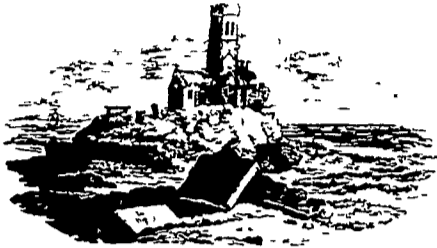

OLD FARMER'S WEATHER FORECASTS

New England: Clear and warm to start, then sunny south, rainy and cool north

Greater New York-New Jersey: Sunny and warm, then clear and hot at midweek, look for showers and seasonal temperatures over weekend

Middle Atlantic Coastal: Clear and very warm, rain at end of week

Piedmont & Southeast Coastal: Cool and rainy, clear at midweek, more showers over weekend

Florida: Cloudy and cool with some sun north at end of week

Upstate N.Y.-Toronto & Montreal: Clear and hot, then light rain, hot east at midweek, turning cloudy

Greater Ohio Valley: Week begins clear and seasonably hot, showers for week's end

Deep South: Showers to start, then clearing at midweek, partly cloudy and scattered showers for week's end

Chicago & Southern Great Lakes: Sunny and hot to midweek, then rain and cool in west

Northern Great Plains-Great Lakes: Partly sunny with showers central first of week, then sunny, seasonal with showers east

Central Great Plains: Cool with some heavy showers and rain all week

Texas-Oklahoma: Clearing, then intermittent rain and seasonal

Rocky Mountain: Week begins warm with few showers, end of week cloudy, cold with rain east

Southwest Desert: Clear, hot north, showers and cooler south, then end of week sunny north, partly cloudy south

Pacific Northwest: Partly cloudy and mild, midweek sunny and warm, weekend cool with light rain

California: Mostly cloudy and cool all week

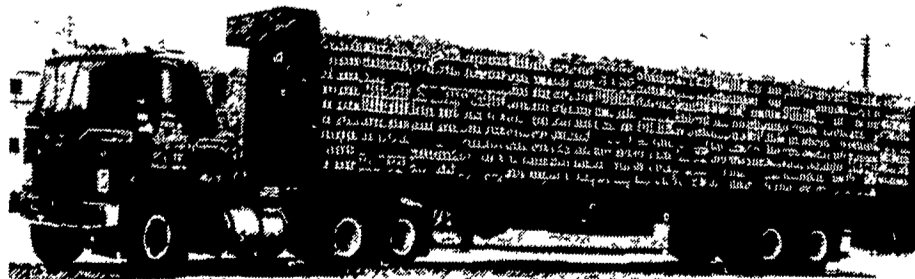
