Judges were Mrs. Lillian Roberts, Lancaster, and Mr. and Mrs. John Barley, Conestoga.

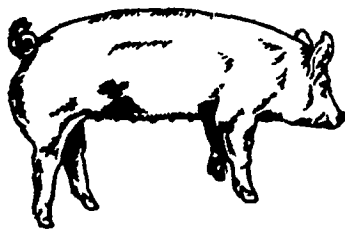
