

4-H leadership congress

UNIVERSITY PARK — 4-H members from around the Commonwealth will learn specialized leadership skills when they take part in Pennsylvania 4-H leadership Congress, June 26 to 29, on Penn State's main campus.

The county delegations will make up approximately 1300 4-H members who will converge to share and contribute ideas which will improve local community programs.

At the 4-H Congress the participants will take part in assemblies, discussion groups, and recreational activities.

"This year's conference will include six areas of leadership orientation and development," say Penn State 4-H agents. "A leadership school for teen leaders, a state leaders forum for adult leaders, delegate workshops for 13- to 15-year-olds, day camping training, and 4-H reporters training are aspects of the program."

Selected teen leaders will attend a special school designed to increase skills to work effectively in planning and conducting county youth programs. Topics will include communications skills, understanding social concerns and group processes, and recreation.

Leaders and Extension staff members will meet with college of agriculture

officials and participate in educational workshops involving the understanding of leadership principles, working with groups, communications, and subject matter related to selected 4-H projects.

Also, scheduled during Congress will be a day-camping leadership program. Youth between the ages of 14 and 17 will be involved in this educational experience.

Leadership Council delegates will arrive on the Penn State Campus June 23 for two days of counseling and orientation to prepare

them for their duties the remainder of the week.

Highlights of the four-day conference will include the Iron Clad Agreement, a dramatic performance about American inventions in the latter half of the 19th Century; Jimmy Gross and Peggy, an electronic musical spectacular; and an educational film, "Grab Hold of Today," starring Dr. Eden Ryl, that offers suspense, excitement, and humor in emphasizing how to eliminate existing negative attitudes and free young people to prepare for tomorrow.

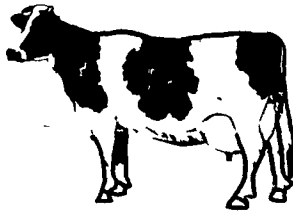
Martha received the honor trip on the basis of her leadership and citizenship activities, reports Henry T. Moon, 4-H specialist at the Pennsylvania State University.
